From Elgar to Elvis, and just in time for the coronation across the pond, the Cape Cod Concert Band presents *The Royal Treatment* at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 30, in the Knight Auditorium at Barnstable High School.

You'll hear selections like *All Shook Up*, featuring the music of Elvis the King, and *Queen in Concert*—that's Queen the rock band, not the monarch. The up-tempo march, *Barnum and Bailey's Favorite*, by the conveniently named Karl King, honors P.T. Barnum, the King of the American Circus. Hollywood royalty is also accounted for, in selections from Maurice Jarre's *Lawrence of Arabia*. Not to forget the proper royals, the concert opens with Franz Joseph Haydn's *March for the Prince of Wales*, a nod to King Charles and his son William. And later on the program, the Band will perform a moving excerpt from Edward Elgar's *Enigma Variations* that was played at the 1953 coronation of the beloved and long-reigning Queen Elizabeth.

The lords of the Celtic lands get their due—with a musical surprise—in Andrew Boyson's *Kirkpatrick Fanfare*, and the mythical kingdom of Camelot comes to life in David Shaffner's sweeping *Legend of the Sword*. In a 2017 work, *Renaissance Reimagined*, by Brian Balmages, courtly style and contemporary sound converge. And because every kingdom needs defending, the Band will perform *Fortress*, by Frank Tichelli, an American composer who is revered by many as wind band royalty.

The Cape Cod Concert Band, an all-volunteer 45-piece wind and percussion ensemble, is conducted by Tom Borning. Also the director of the Falmouth Town Band, Mr. Borning plays trumpet across New England, and is the host and creator of *The Everything Music Ed Podcast*, set to launch later this year.
